
Swati says, 'I think there are two kinds, Ma'am.'

'Yes, that's correct,' says Miss Patil. 'There are two kinds of pandas—the giant panda, which is black and white, and the red panda, also called the lesser panda.'

Just then, there is a knock on the door. Miss Patil opens it.

'Oh! What a lovely surprise! Children, please welcome Panda. He is a giant panda. He is here to answer all your questions.'

The children are very excited to see Panda. They want to feel his fur, but Miss Patil says, 'Questions first.'



'Where do you come from?' asks Robin.

Panda replies, 'We, giant pandas, are usually found in the forests of central China. My cousins, red pandas, are found not only in China but also in Myanmar, Nepal, and the Himalayan forests of India.'

'How big do you grow?' asks Amir.

'Very big! Male giant pandas grow to about 6 feet in height and weigh more than 110 kilos. Female giant pandas weigh lesser—at about 105 kilos.'

'What is your favourite food?' asks Smita.

'Our favourite food is bamboo. We can eat bamboo for breakfast, lunch, and dinner. We eat its stem, leaves, and shoots. We have to eat large quantities of bamboo to get the nourishment we need. We can spend about 10 to 12 hours a day eating. But captive pandas, found in zoos, have a wide variety of food. They may eat cereals, milk, and garden vegetables.

'Please tell us more about the red panda,' says Rohit.

'Our cousins, red pandas, are much smaller. They usually grow as big as a full-grow cat. They have long, bushy tails, reddish-brown fur on the back, and black fur on the belly. They too love to eat bamboo. But they also eat insects and fruits, and


