- 1 The pressures of childhood or the pleasures of childhood? Children always wonder why they have to slog. They always want to play and find concentrating on studies difficult. Most schools, instead of instilling confidence in the students, only put fear into them. In many schools the strength of a classroom is about sixty or even more. So, it is practically impossible for teachers to attend to each student's problems.
